STAR - Literacy / Math

- STAR: Literacy assessment tool used at all grade levels
 - Fall/Winter/and Spring
- STAR: Math assessment tool used with grade 10 students only
 - Students do the assessment at the beginning of their grade 10 math course.
 - 1 time and will be done in both Semesters.

** All of these first Assessments will be complete by this Friday.







<u>Advanced Placement</u>



- Advanced Placement provides students the opportunity to experience college-level work while in high school.
 - Curriculum aligns very closely with Alberta curriculum so the workload is manageable
- By enrolling in AP courses, students demonstrate that they are interested in challenging themselves and learning at a college level
- Based on studies of students at U of A and U BC:
 - Most popular courses: Calculus, English and Chemistry
 - Even with only one AP exam, students outperform non-AP students by over 11% (by over 20% with 3 or more exams)



Advanced Placement



- AP students have access to resources in AP Classroom
 - Topic questions assigned by teacher to check understanding and give immediate feedback
 - Progress checks give real-time feedback on topics and skills
 - My Assignments screen allows students to see what's coming up and view detailed results with links for further study
 - AP daily videos are available for all AP courses and cover the content and skills being taught in class



<u>Advanced Placement</u>



- More than 75% of admission officers surveyed said that a low score on an AP Exam would not harm an applicant's admission prospects
- Students must make an exam decision by the end of October
 - Cost to write the exam is \$140
 - Cancellation fee is \$60
- Students getting a grade of 4 or 5 qualify for transfer credit (option to not take a junior level course)
 or advanced placement (taking a senior level course without taking the junior level first)
- We strongly encourage all AP students to write the exams for the courses they are taking!



Advanced Placement



- 230 students registered in one or more of the 24 courses we offer.
- Visiting AP classrooms this month to talk about AP exams, deadlines, and the exam fee.
- An AP parent session will be held in October.
- Waiting to hear from the University of Alberta. They typically host an AP information for students. I
 am attending an information session on September 27. More information to be shared at our next
 school council meeting.



Student Supports:

- Have a new system in place that allows us to support our students more effectively.
- Student supports Admin Assistant
 - 1st contact
 - Accommodation Organization
 - Cultural Room & Supports Supervision
 - Organization & Management of our Audio Exams.



- Parents as well.


