What is a School Council?

School Council is made up of parents, the school principal, a teacher representative, a student representative and a representative of the community. School Council's main roles are to advise the principal/school board on policies and practices of the school/school board, to work together with the school to support and enhance student learning, be a source of information for parents and to invite input.

What Kind of Work Does the School Council Complete?

School Council members work together to facilitate development of a common vision for the school, to enhance communication, planning and resource allocation. School Council provides advice and consultation to the school principal regarding priorities, programs and policies that are needed to meet and enhance student learning. School Council does not manage the day-to-day operations of the school.

In recent years we have advised on the school's communication plan, gathered parent input through surveys, helped redesign the registration manual and website, provided a staff appreciation coffee break, sponsored Learning Clicks presentations, and sponsor a School Council Award. School Council cooperates with other school councils by sharing information, ideas, and by providing advice and information to EIPS and Alberta Education.

Who Can be a Member of School Council?

All parents who have a child attending Bev Facey Community High School are automatically members of the School Council.

The School Council executive is formed each September. Parents are encouraged to participate in School Council. It is an excellent way to ensure the school, parents and community are connected.

Who Can Attend School Council Meetings?

All parents are welcome to attend School Council meetings. You do not need to be an executive member to attend and regular attendance isn't required.

When Does School Council Meet?

The BF School Council meets 8 times per year. Typically School Council meets the second Tuesday of every month at 6:30 pm in the library located upstairs. Parents can enter at the main entrance and use the main staircase to go upstairs. At the top of the stairs they can go to the left down the hallway to the library entrance.

How Does School Council Communicate With Parents?

School Council uses the school's mass email communication system, the school's Synrevoice messaging, includes regular submissions in the school's electronic newsletter and posts meeting summaries on School Council's section of the school's website, under the Parent tab.
