**Orange Shirt Day:** All students are encouraged to participate in Orange Shirt Day this Friday Sept 30th. Orange Shirt Day is an outcome of the 2013 Joseph Mission Residential School Commemoration Project and Reunion that took place in Williams Lake, BC. The name stems from a story told by former residential school student, Phyllis Webstad, who had her new orange shirt, bought by her grandmother, taken from her as a six-year old girl. She spoke powerfully of how it seemed to her that nobody cared and, in this personal way, her story speaks to the many harms experienced by children in the residential schools. Wearing an orange shirt is way to show you care and honor those affected by residential schools and racism.
