Projects for this year include literacy and numeracy supports, Elder supports, cultural engagement opportunities, graduation enhancement supports, and gold-standard initiatives like the Blanket Exercise and Project of Heart. Schools in EIPS will be eligible again this spring to submit requests for funding for the 2017/2018 school year so start your wishlists now.

What We've Been Up To

I'd like to personally welcome a few new faces to our team. Rudolph Hening is our first school to have completed Blanket Exercises for every single student - a goal they accomplished by the middle of September this year! Moving forward, they plan to

have the Blanket Exercise live in the Grade 7 program. Rudolph Hening and Fort Saskatchewan High School, along with several other schools, are also creating a relationship with an Elder and accessing his support on a regular basis for students and staff keen to build a connection and infuse Indigenous knowledge into current curriculum. A heartfelt thank you to Elder Wilson and to all of the schools leading the way by taking action to follow the new proposed TQS standards.

On October 25th, we will gather, listen, and learn with Charlene Bearhead, Education Lead for the National Centre for Truth and Reconciliation. This session is currently at maximum registration but, with principal approval, you are still welcome to add your name to the wait list. RISE (Reconciliation in Solidarity in Edmonton), will also be joining us for this special professional development day.
