# Graduation Requirements

ALBERTA HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA: GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS (ENGLISH)
The requirements indicated in this chart are the <u>minimum</u> requirements for a student to attain an Alberta High School Diploma. The requirements for entry into post-secondary institutions and workplaces may require additional and/or specific courses.
100 CREDITS including the following:
ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS – 30 LEVEL (English Language Arts 30-1 or 30-2)
SOCIAL STUDIES – 30 LEVEL (Social Studies 30-1 or 30-2)
MATHEMATICS – 20 LEVEL (Mathematics 20-1, Mathematics 20-2 or Mathematics 20-3)
SCIENCE – 20 LEVEL <sup>1</sup> (Science 20, Science 24, Biology 20, Chemistry 20 or Physics 20)
PHYSICAL EDUCATION 10 (3 CREDITS) <sup>2</sup>
CAREER AND LIFE MANAGEMENT (3 CREDITS) <sup>3</sup>
10 CREDITS IN ANY COMBINATION FROM: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Career and Technology Studies (CTS) courses</li> <li>• Fine Arts courses</li> <li>• Second Languages <sup>4</sup> courses</li> <li>• Physical Education 20 and/or 30</li> <li>• Knowledge and Employability courses</li> <li>• Registered Apprenticeship Program courses</li> <li>• Locally developed/acquired and authorized courses in CTS, fine arts, second languages or Knowledge and Employability occupational courses <sup>5</sup></li> </ul>

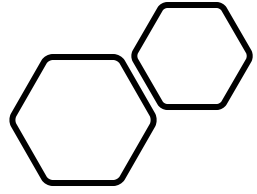
**Notes:**

- French and Français are not the same course and not interchangeable.
- A course cannot be repeated after a higher level course has been taken in the same sequence.
- Averages are not rounded up for scholarship purposes.
- The value of the scholarship is calculated on the overall average in five designated courses as listed under each grade level.
- All courses listed on an official Alberta Transcript of High School Achievement are acceptable (excludes Driver's Education), and only marks obtained before the start of post-secondary study can be used.
- Courses with a "Pass" on a high school transcript are equivalent to a 50% mark.
- CALM course can be taken in any grade, but the final mark will be calculated in Grade 11.

# Rutherford Scholarship

- We use Rutherford criteria to calculate honours within the school
- 2 tiers of funding
  - 75% - 79.9%
  - 80%+
- Cannot apply until you are in your post-secondary program

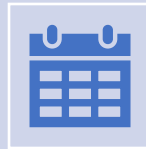
- Grad wear has been open to order for 3 weeks and closes tomorrow, Friday, March 11, 2022

# Facey Formal

- Survey information
  - Student survey
    - 49% of students rated a family meal in the top 2 things of importance for a graduation celebration, 77% had it in their top 3
    - 34% of student rated a banquet by the school in the top 2 things of importance for a graduation celebration, 42% had it in their bottom 2 of importance
  - Parent survey
    - 79% of parents rated a family meal in the top 2 choices
    - 65% of parents rated a banquet in the top 2 choices
    - 10% of parents are willing to pay our estimated cost of a banquet ticket
    - 100% of parents are willing to pay our estimated cost of a Facey Formal ticket



# Grad Fee & Ticket Sales

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- Grad fee already applied to student fees is \$\$
  - Student grad fee covers:
    - Grad gown rental
    - Grad cap and tassel (to keep)
    - Diploma cover
    - Grad 2022 memento
    - Graduate's attendance at the Ceremony
- Tickets will need to be purchased for:
  - Attendance to the Ceremony (estimated \$20)
    - Graduate does not require a ticket
  - Attendance to the Facey Formal (estimated \$20-30)

- Ceremony begins at 1:00 pm
- There is a fee for parking

- There will be some seating available but it will be limited

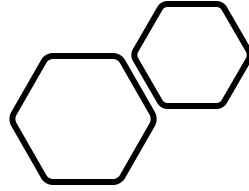




# Graduating Student Input
