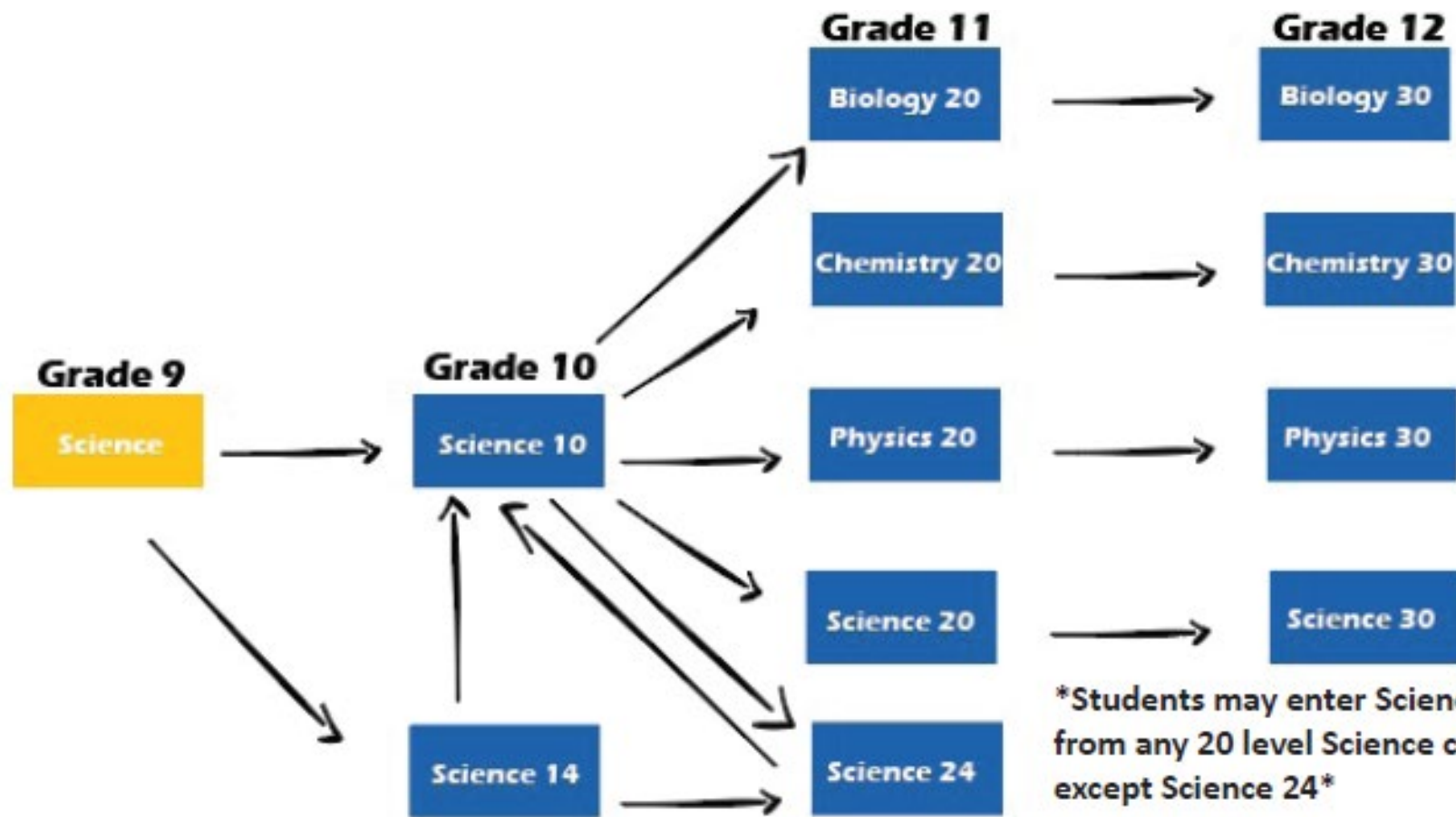
Math

Science

•**Science 10:** I want to take Biology, Chemistry, Physics or Science 20.

•**Science 14:** I want to complete the science requirement for my diploma, but will not be taking any science after high school.



Students may enter Science 30 from any 20 level Science course except Science 24

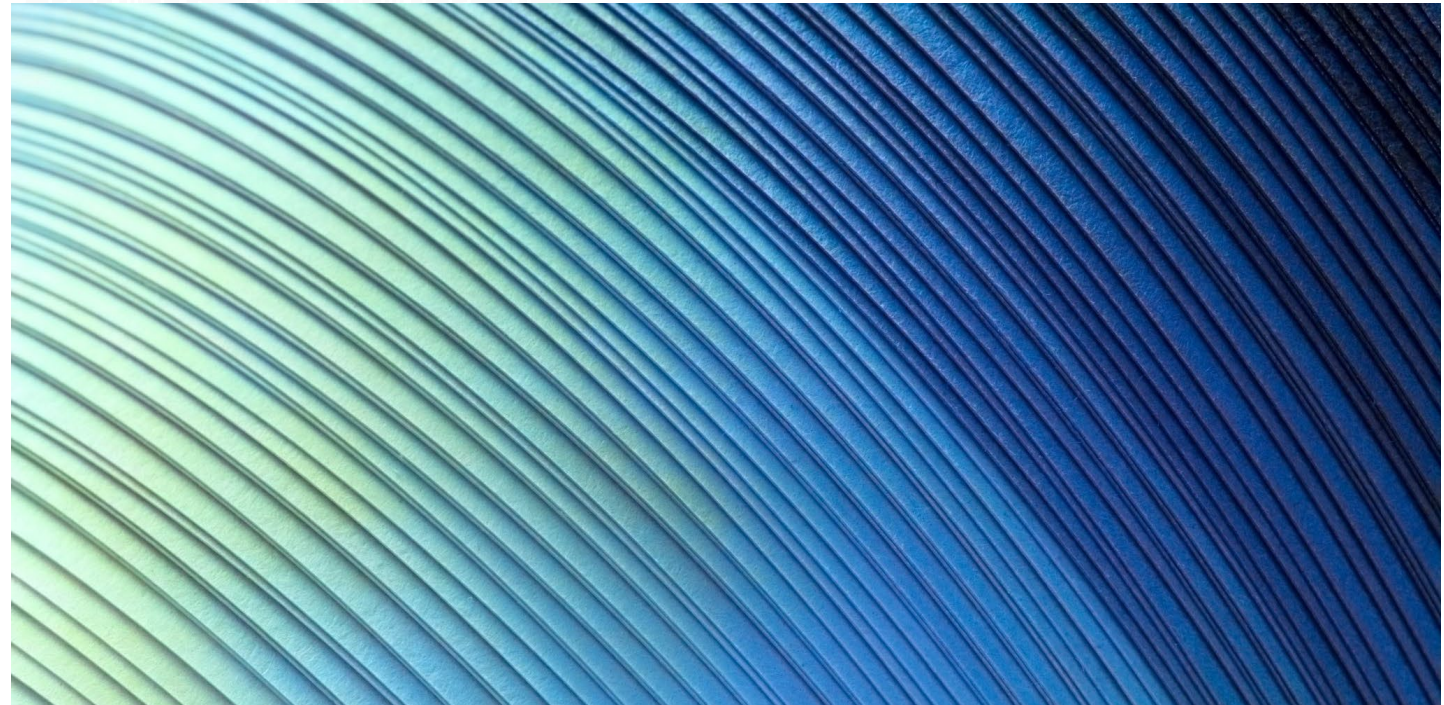

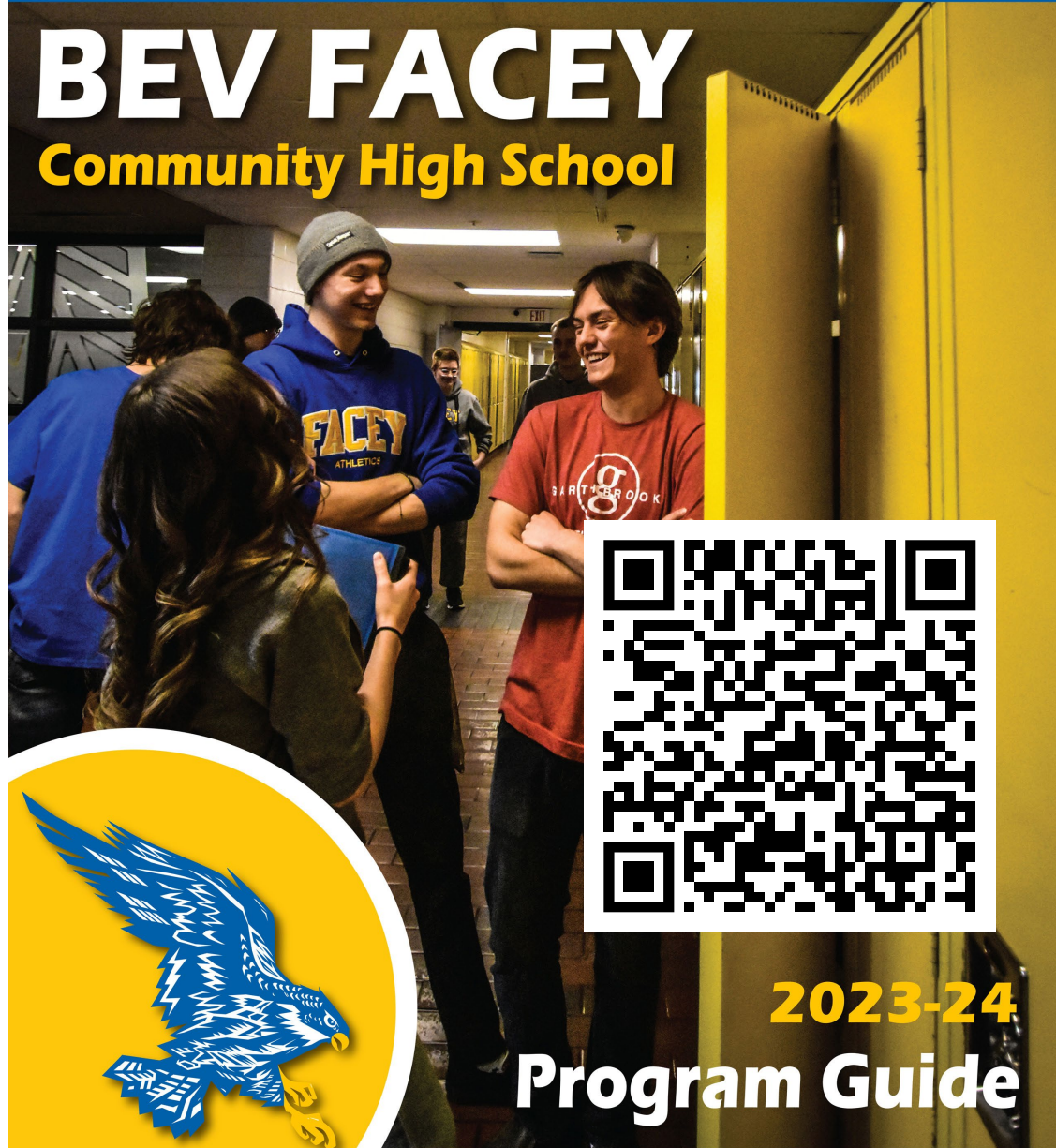

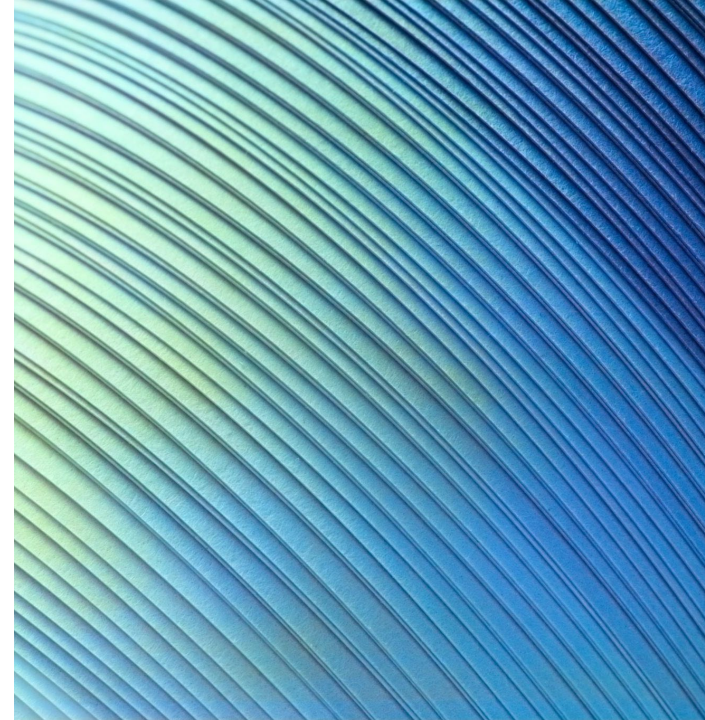
